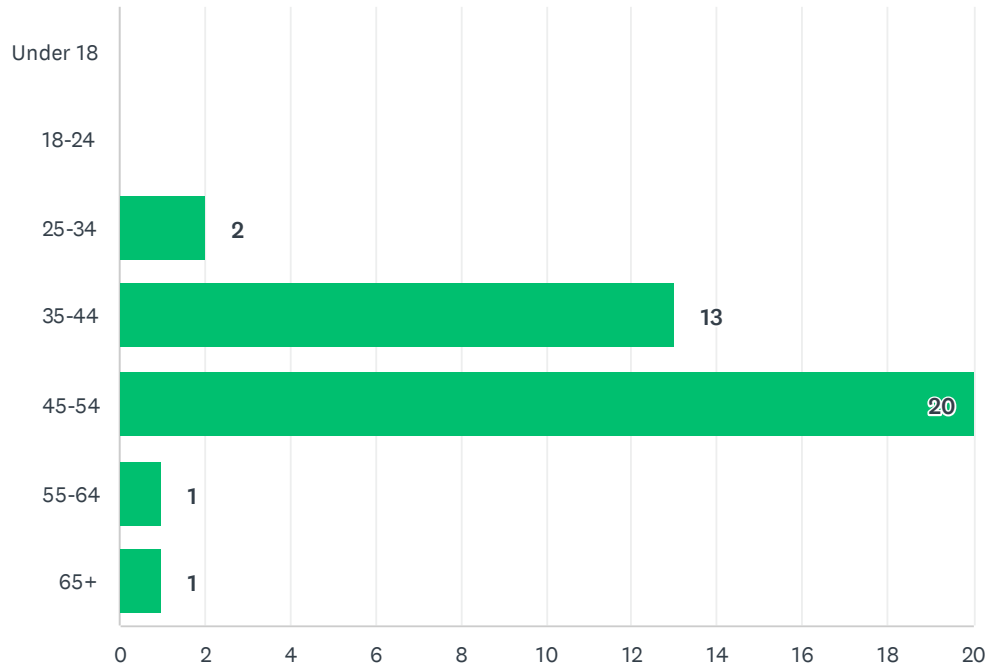

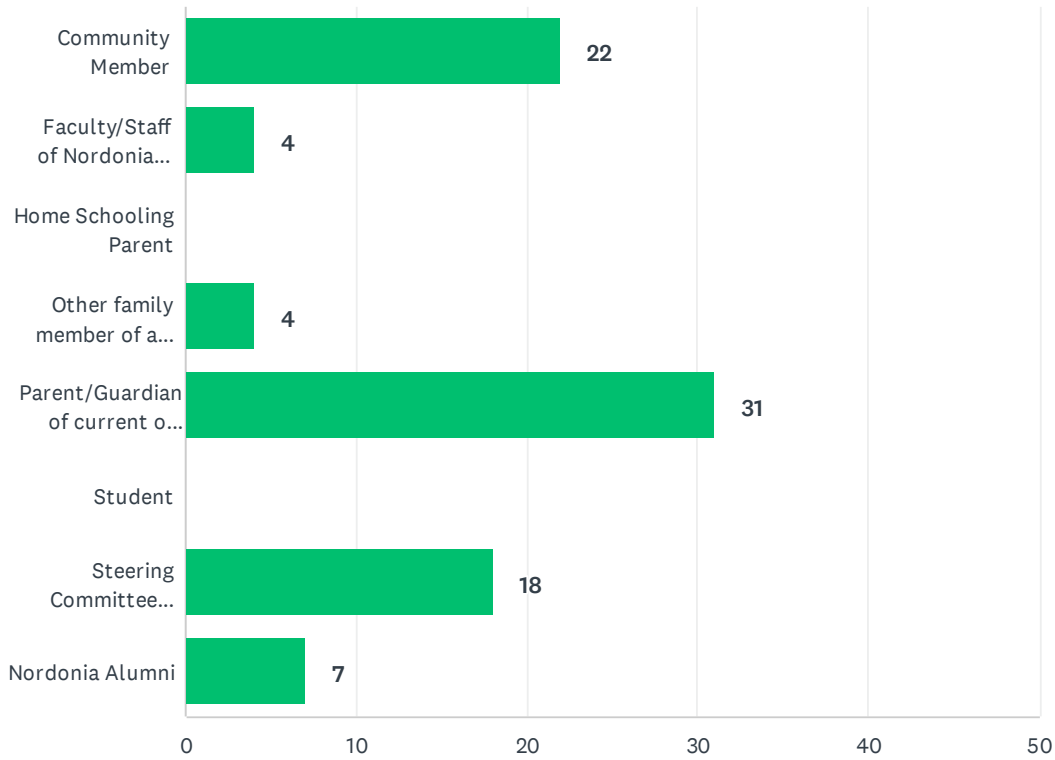

## Q2 Which group best represents you? Please check all that apply.

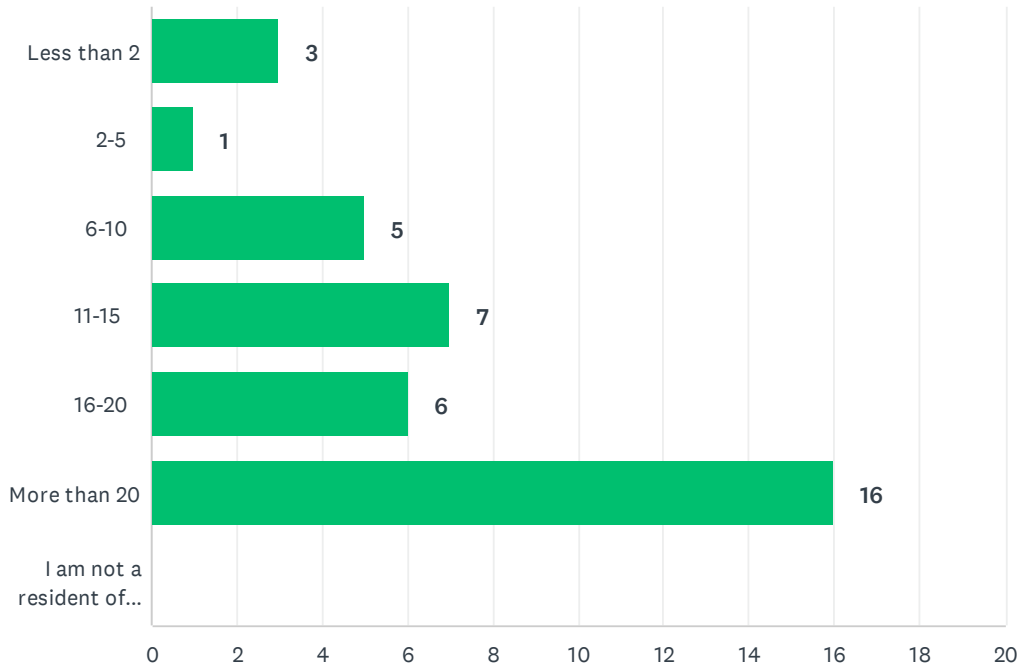

### Q3 How many years have you lived in the Nordonia Hills City School District?

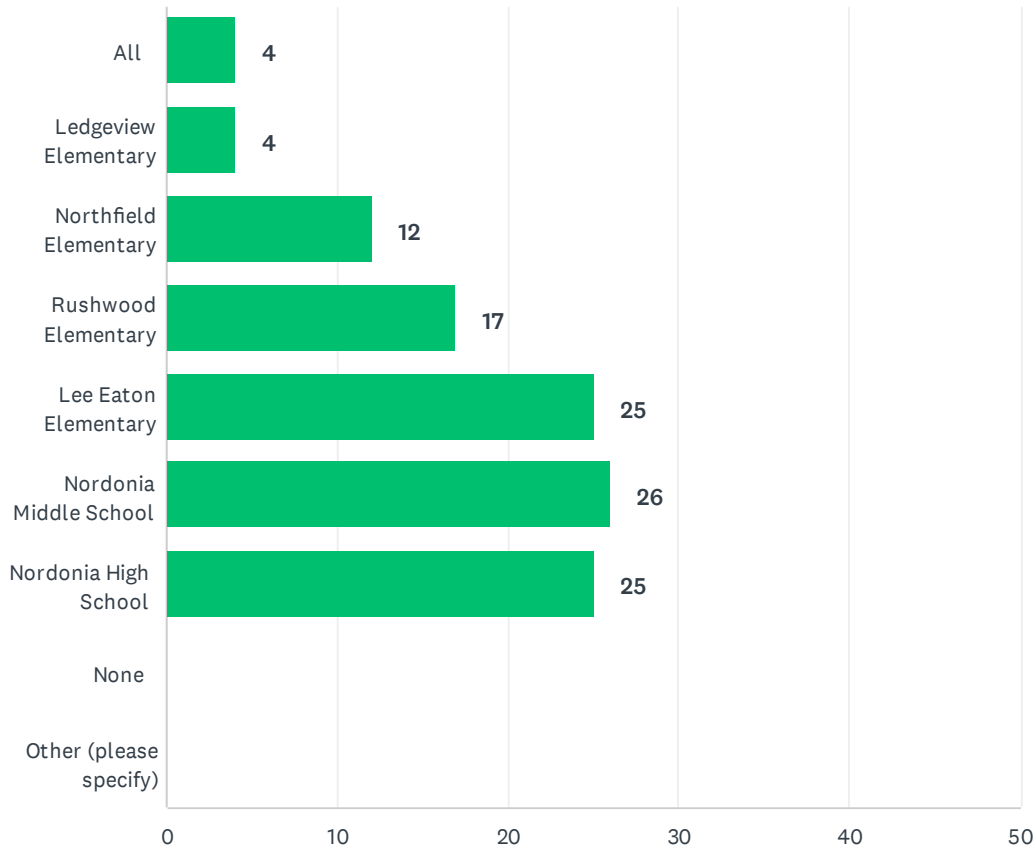

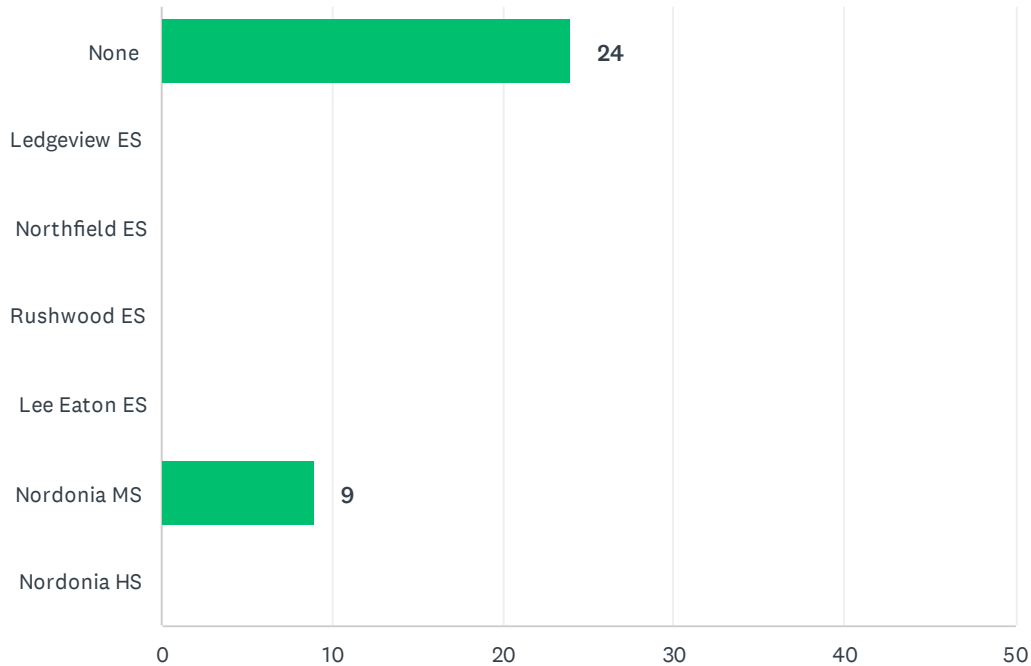

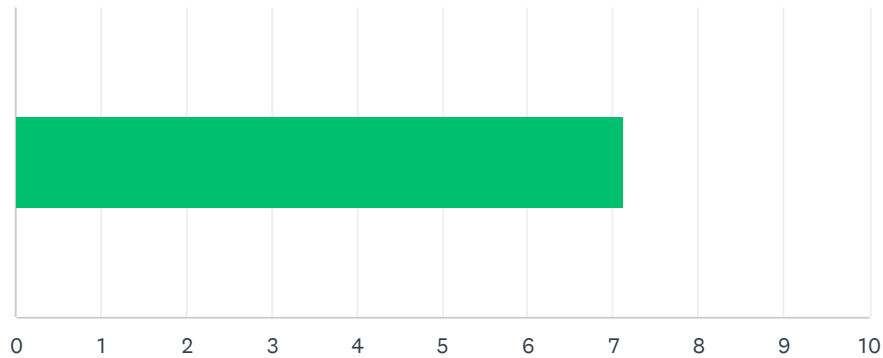

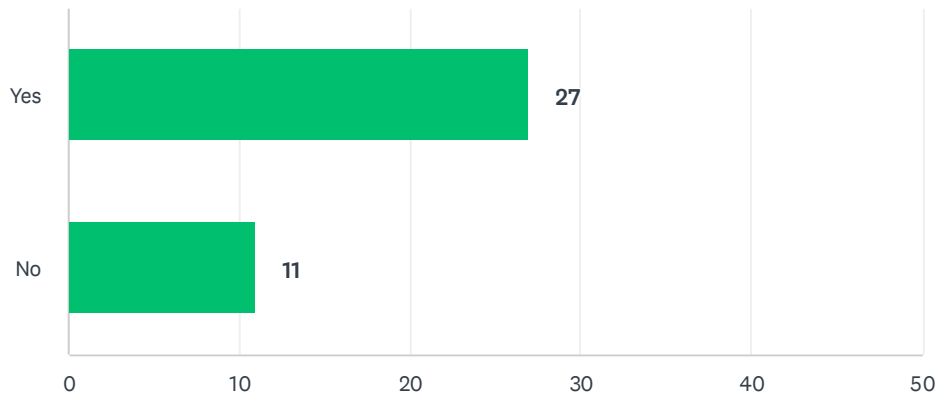

## Q14 Did the School District's reputation impact your residential decision?

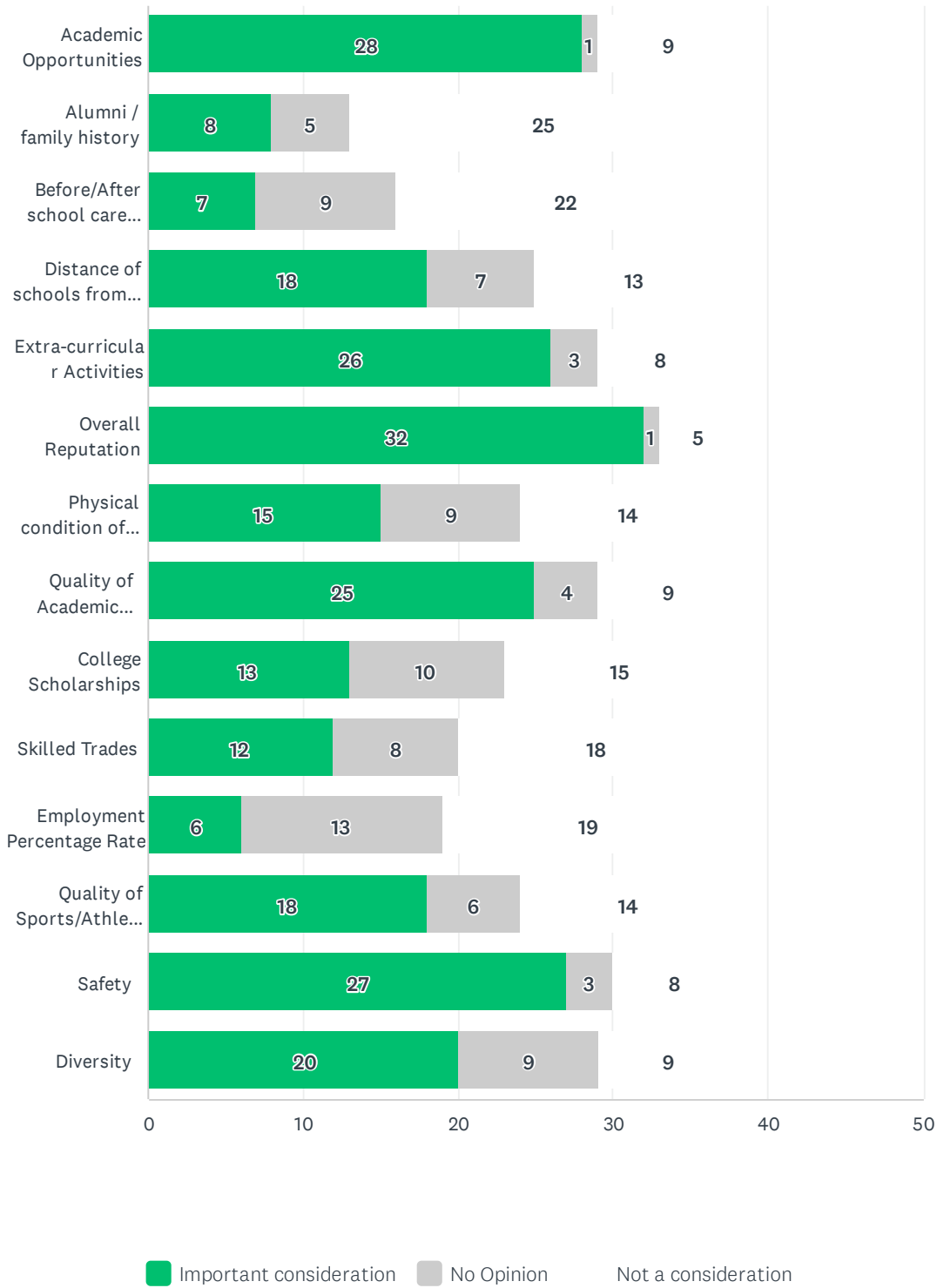

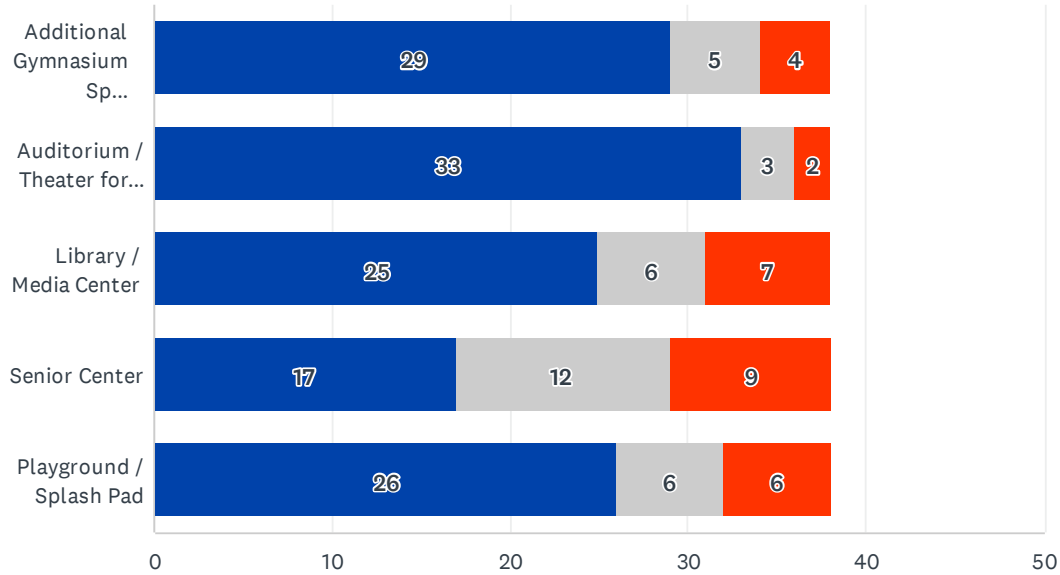

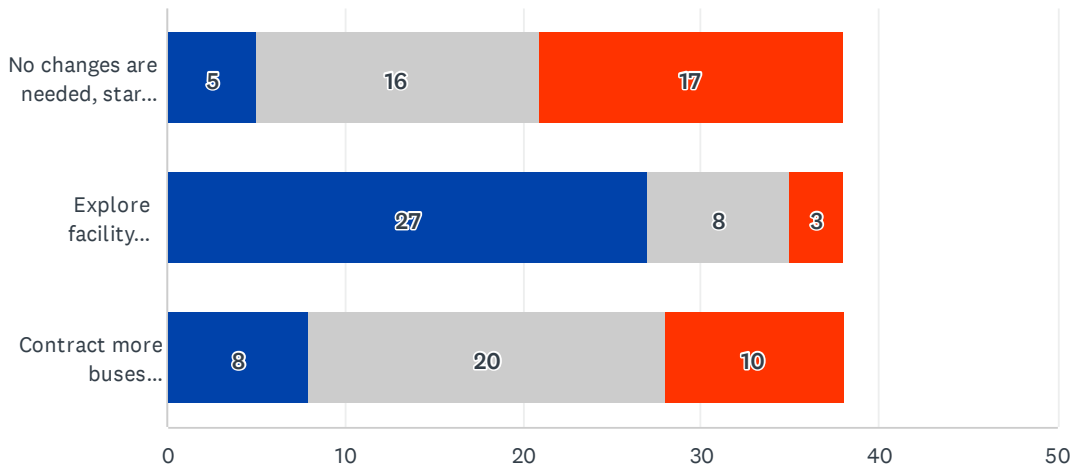

3	I believe we can build a new structure on Rushwood property that could become the 5-8 Middle School without interrupting classes, we could build behind/around the Middle school and make a centrally located single K-4 building to replace them all without interrupting the school year. Once kids move around old buildings could be demolished and parking lot construction, field replacements could begin. Then, if we took the property that makes up the bus garage and the softball field, and worked with the city to close South Bedford so it dead ended at the school boundaries we could build a brand new high school east of the existing building (over the roadway and on top of the existing field and bus garage), use the existing footprint to replace the softball field and create a new parking lot, and keep the HS "attached" to the existing HS football stadium. I believe we can maximize our existing property at these three locations by building upward. A taller building will give us more square footage with less roof to repair over the next 50 years than a single story approach like the existing high school.
