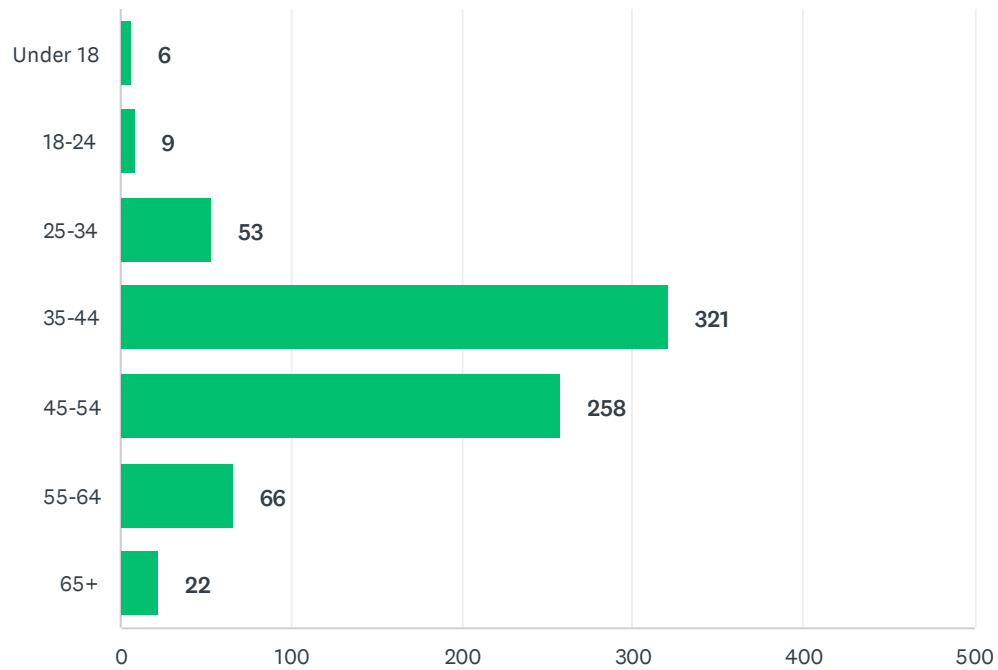

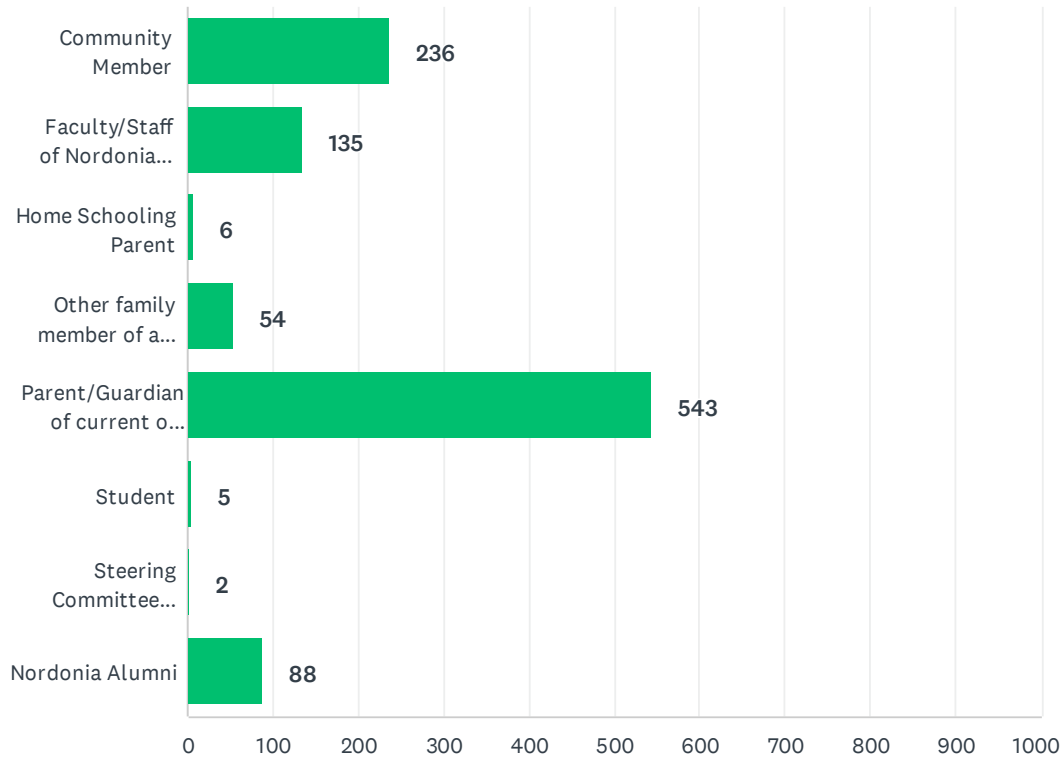

Q2 Which group best represents you? Please check all that apply.

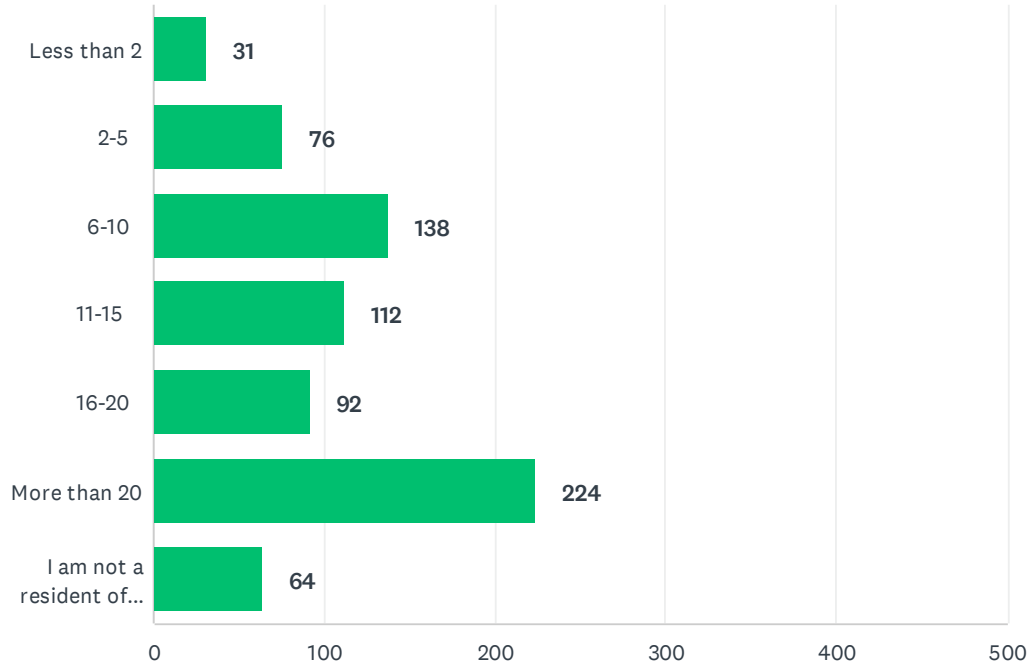

Q3 How many years have you lived in the Nordonia Hills City School District?

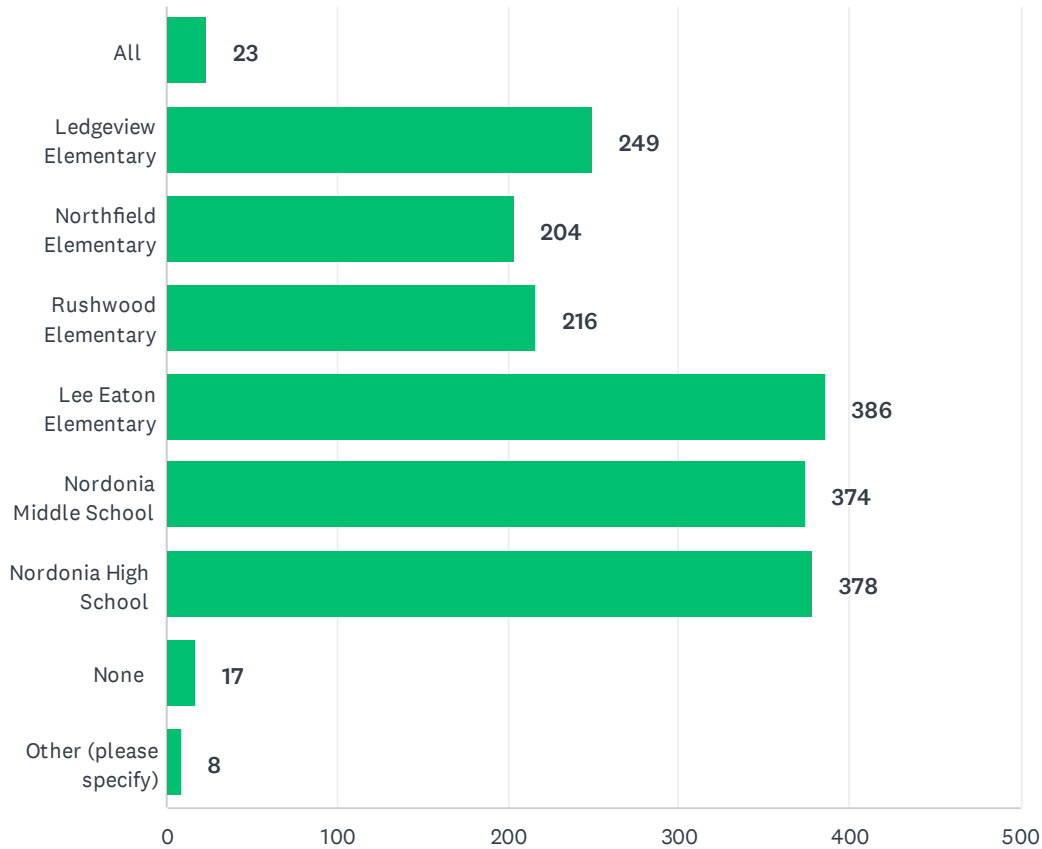

Q13 Do you believe updated/newer school facilities impact the economic development of the region?

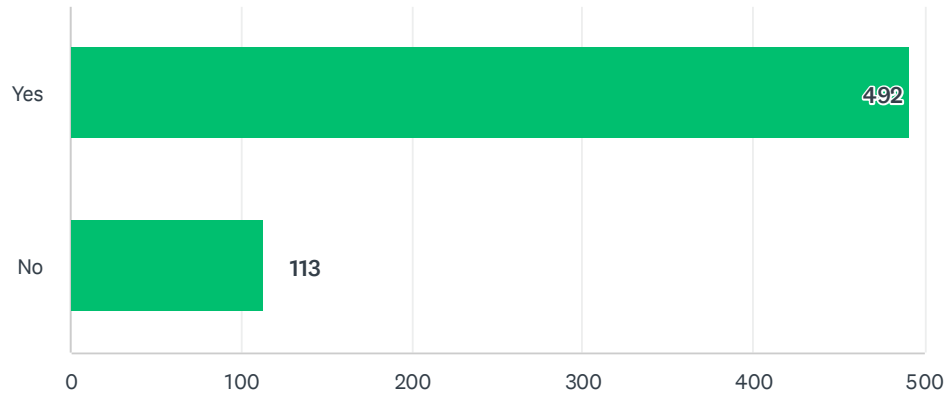

Q14 Did the School District's reputation impact your residential decision?

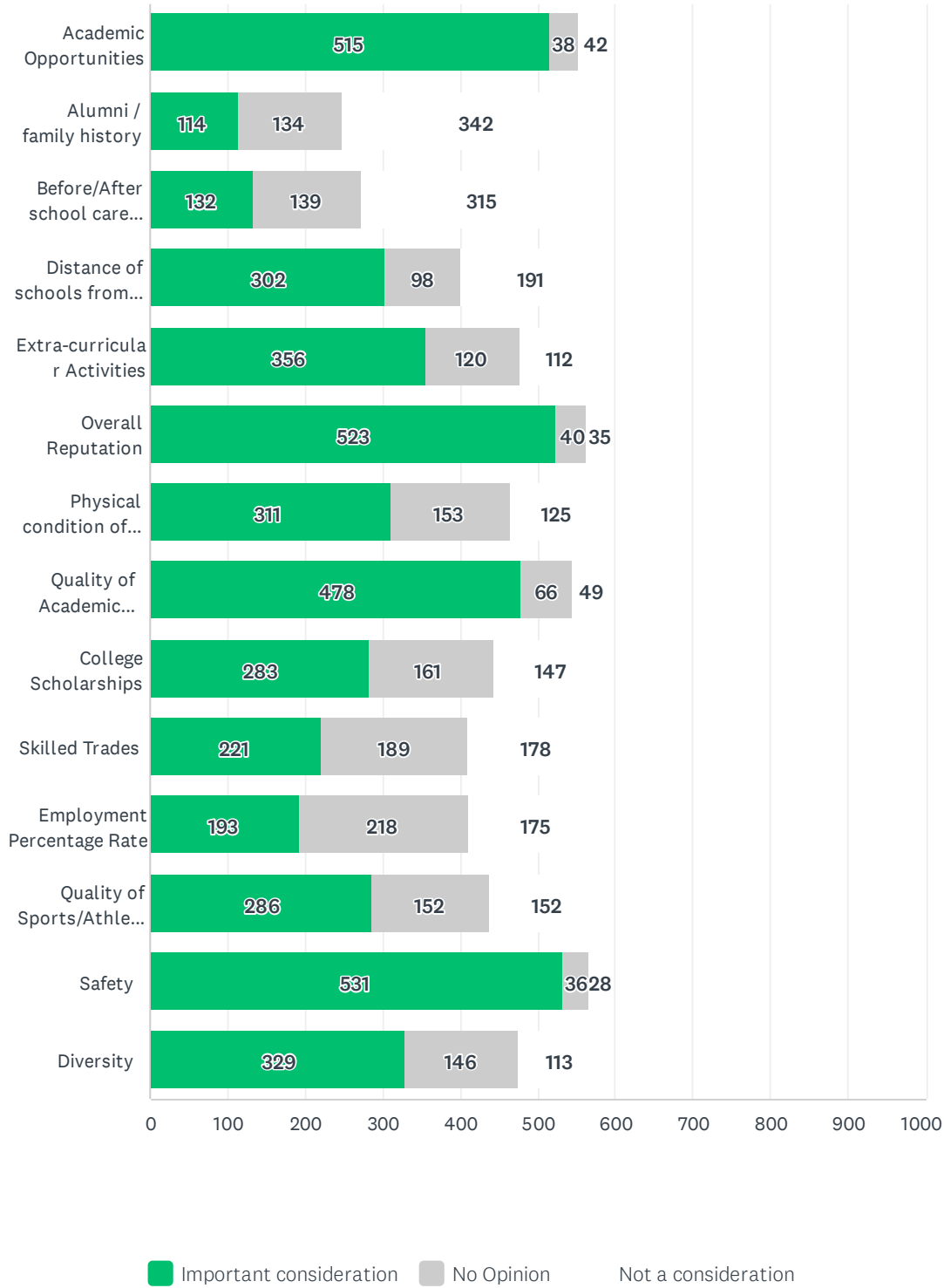

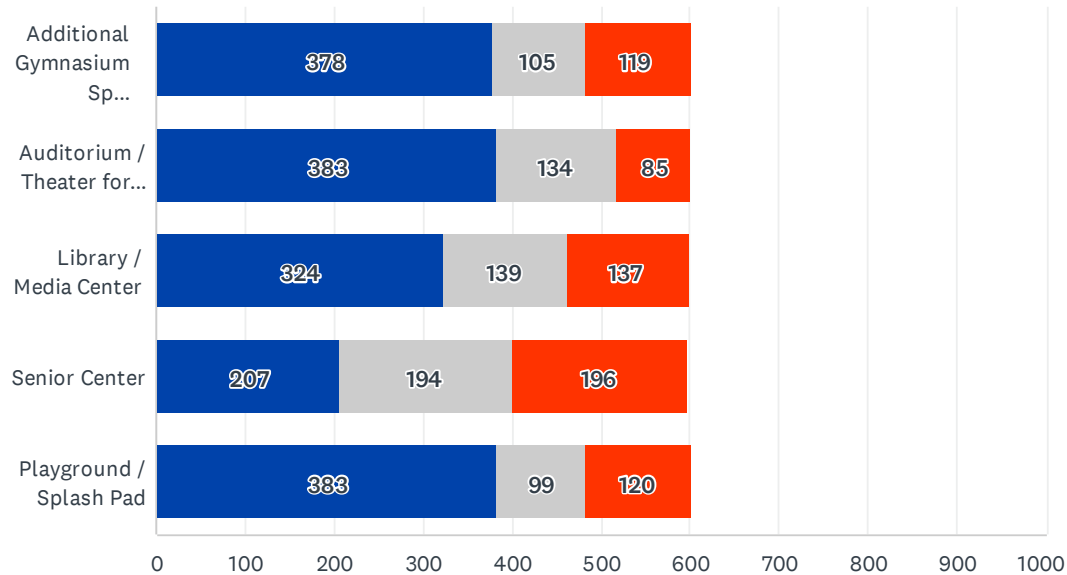

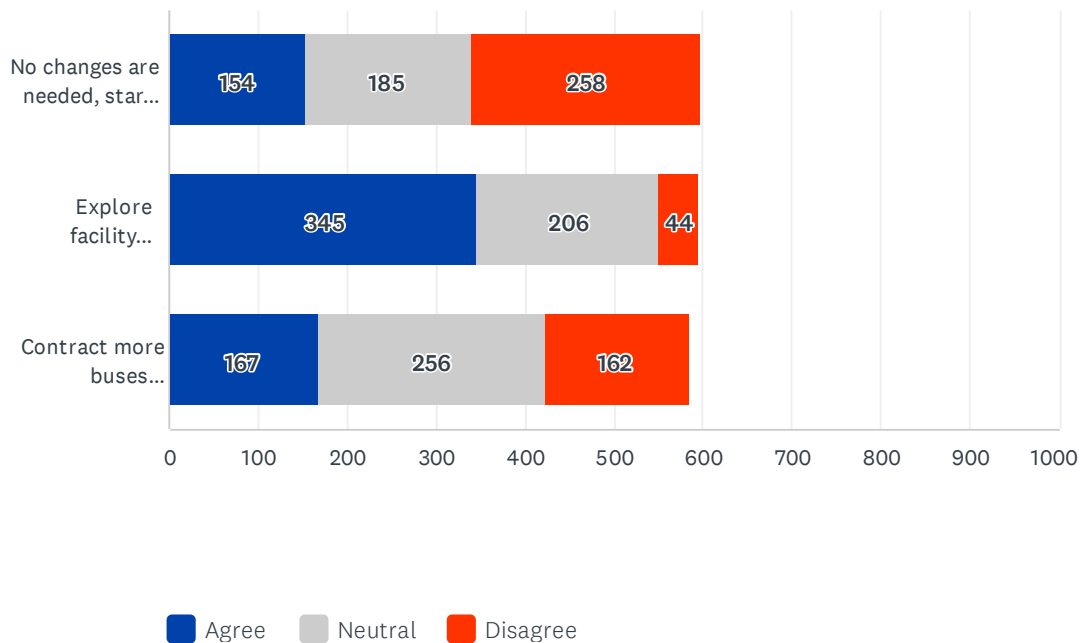
