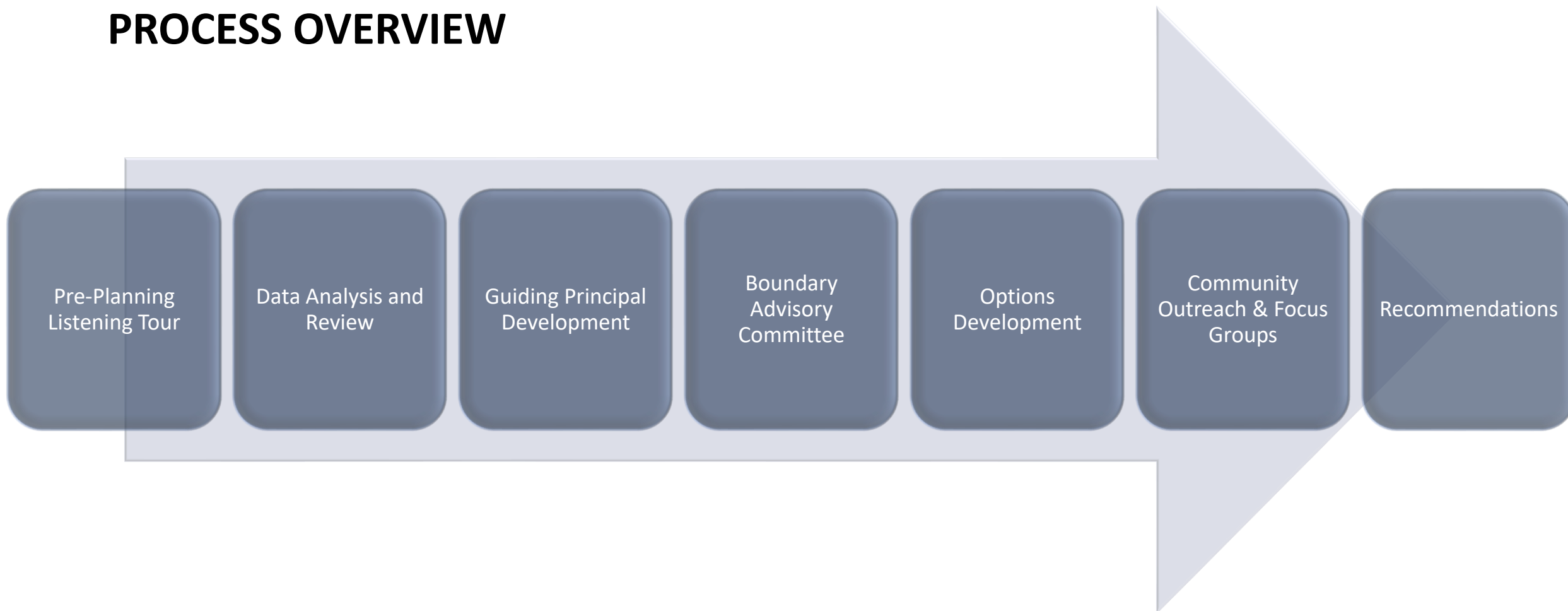

PROGRAMMATIC CONSIDERATIONS

The following programmatic changes are currently under consideration and may have some impacts on this process and vice versa.

- **Churchill** – K-5 Walk only boundary
- **Hoover** – Montessori expansion, district wide option
- **Franklin** – back to a neighborhood boundary only
- **Longfellow** – Combination of walking boundary and district wide option
- **Spanish Immersion** – Move from Gage to Bishop
- **Newcomer** – Move from Riverside to Bamber Valley



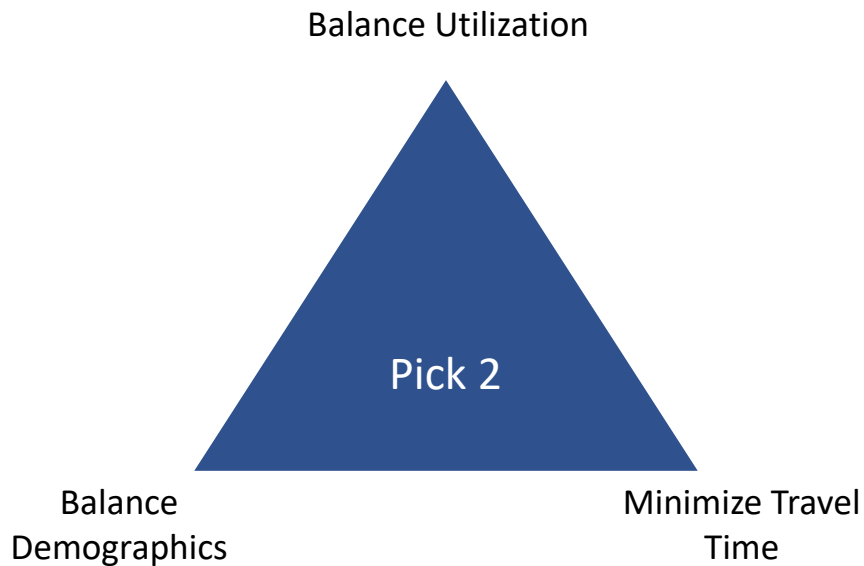
Boundary Advisory Committee

- Not a decision-making group, but a group that is representative of the community to provide feedback throughout the process and interpret feedback from the broader community.
- Roles & Responsibilities
 - Keep an objective view, consider all students.
 - Provide feedback during options development.
 - Make recommendations to district leadership.

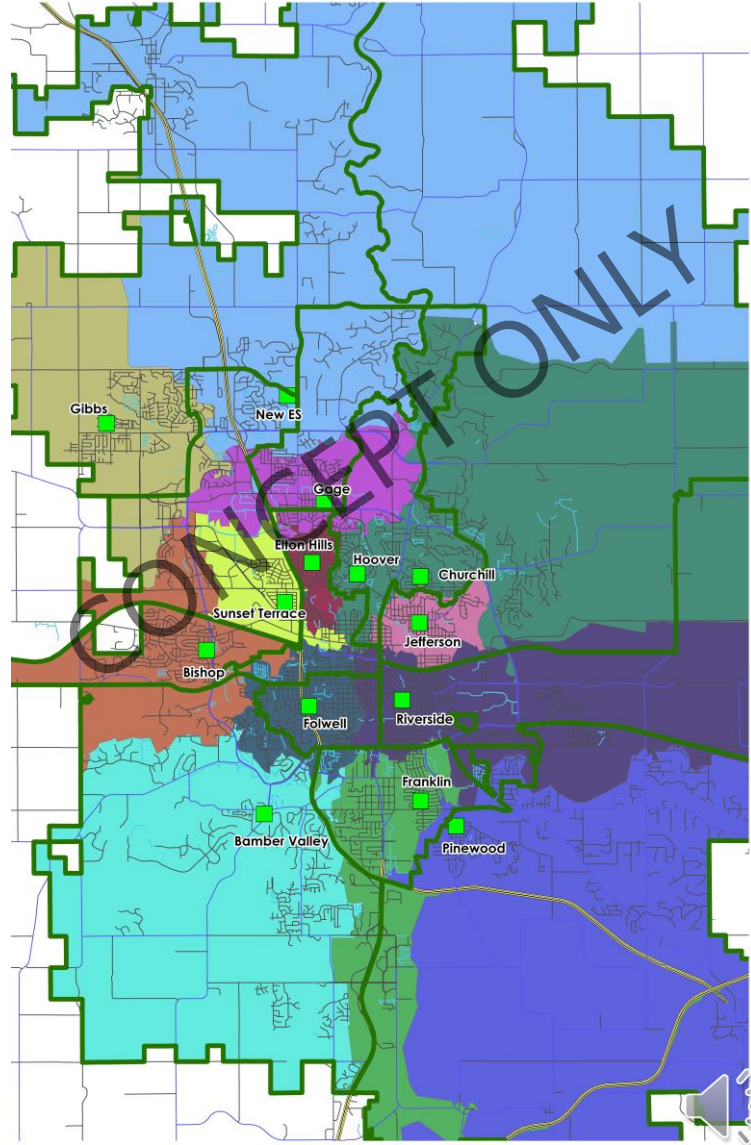

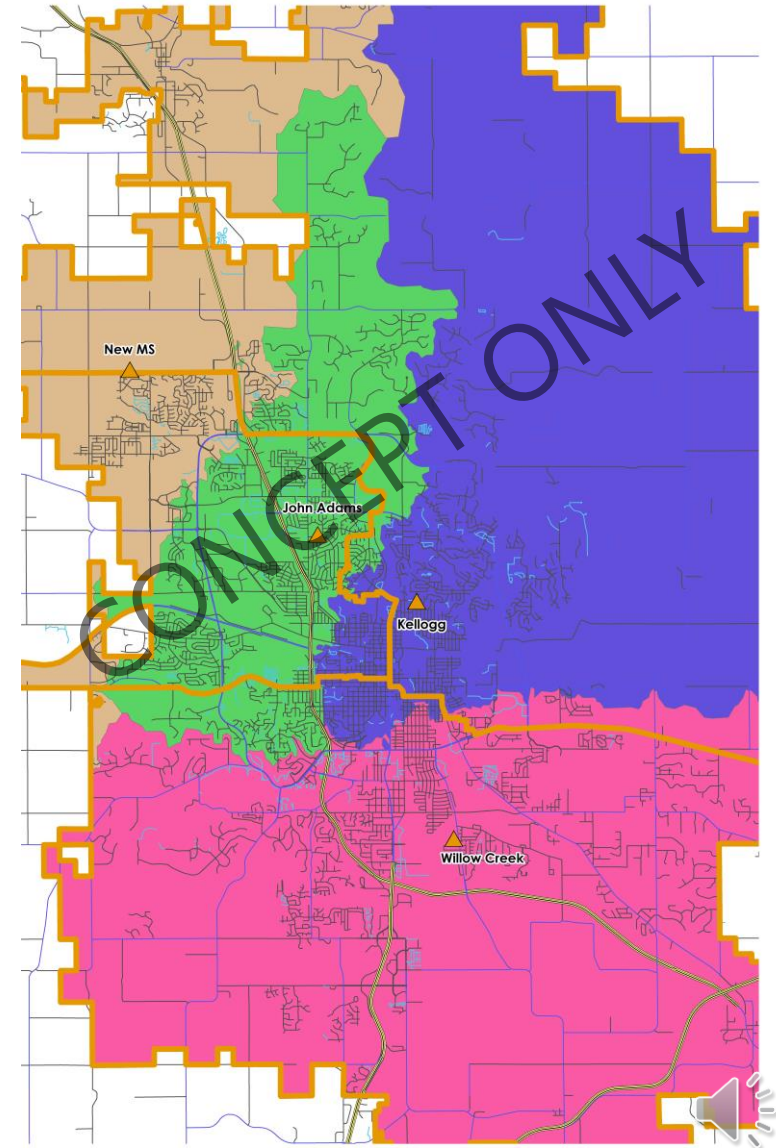

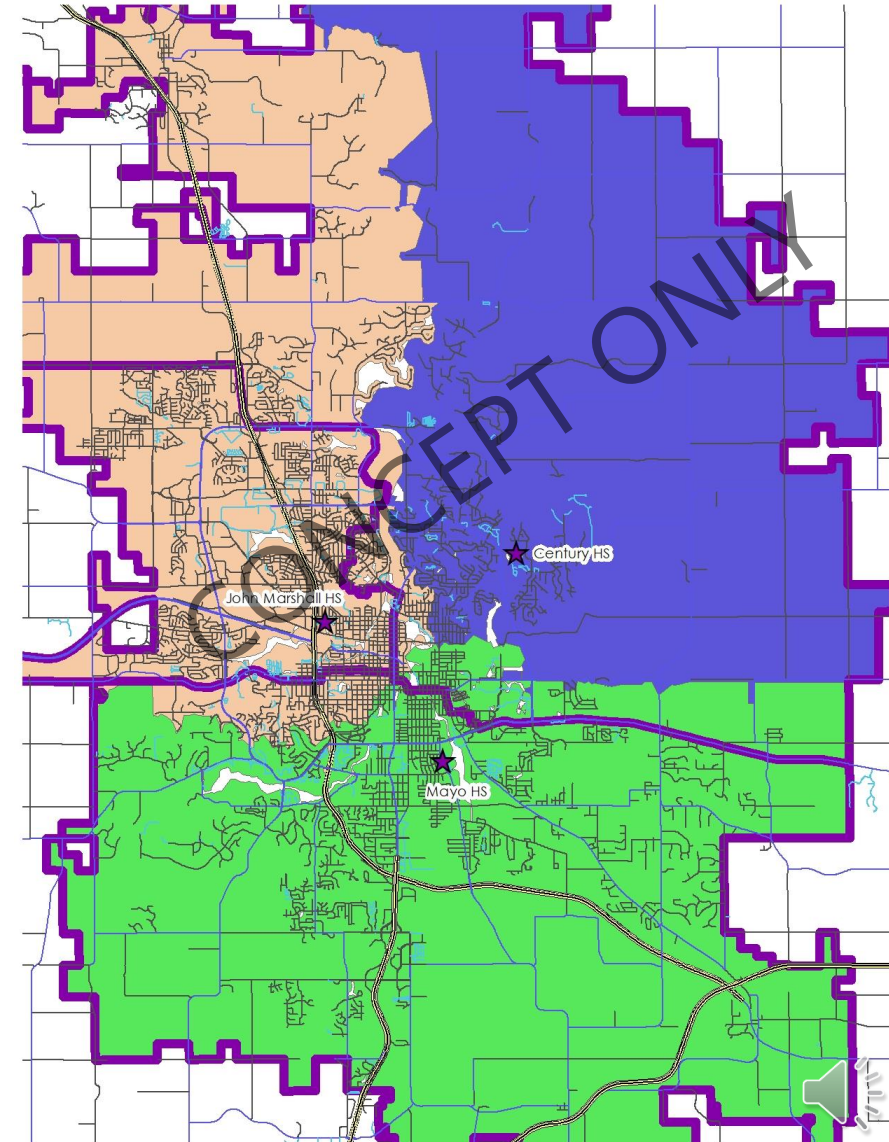

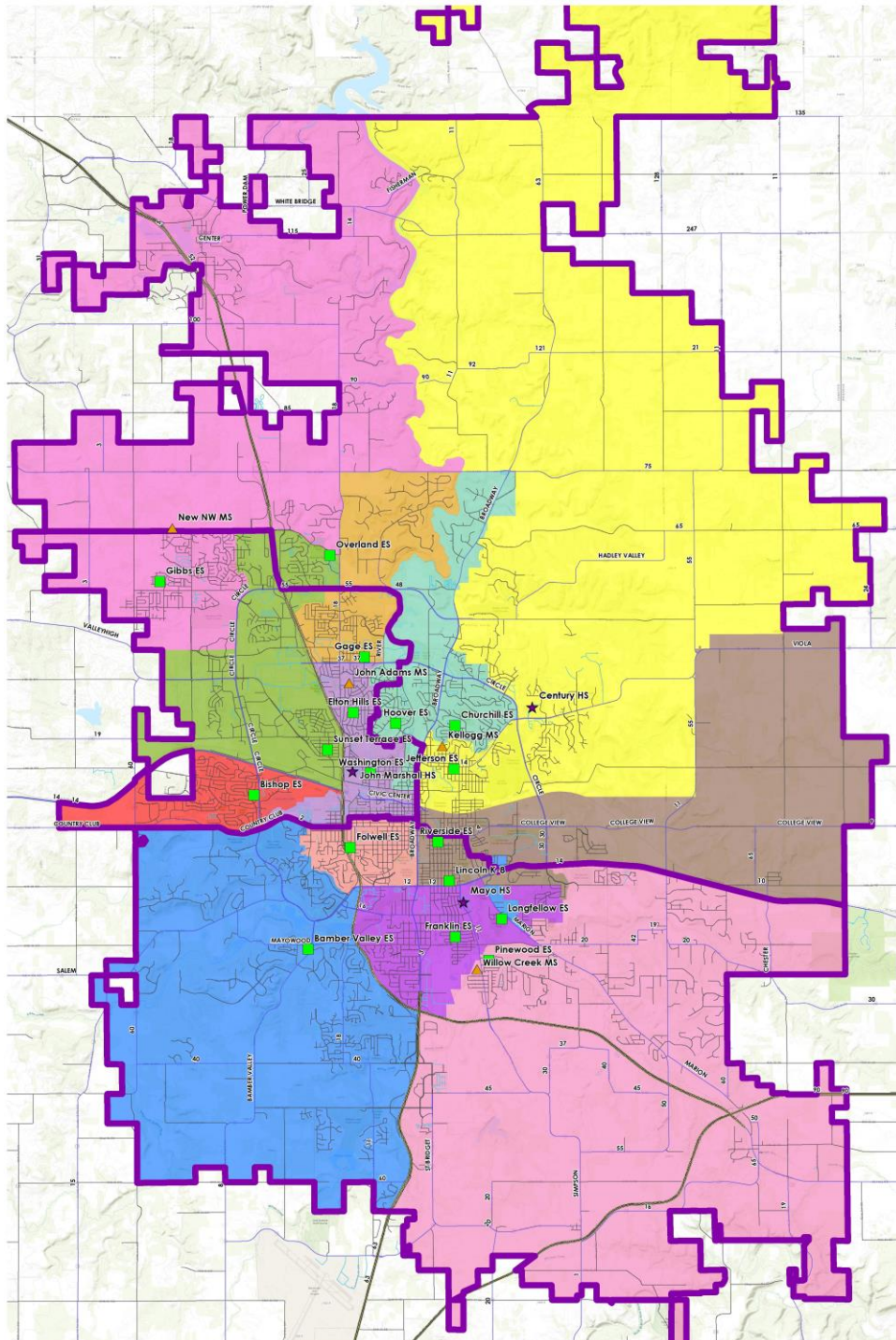

- All high schools remain over 90% utilization
